STUDENTS DO YOU WANT TO PARK ON CAMPUS NEXT YEAR?

If so, you and your parent(s) will need to attend a Smart Start class. The classes for the fall will be scheduled soon. All classes begin at 6:30 and are approximately two hour long and are free. The Start Smart program is an opportunity for new drivers and their parents/guardians to clearly understand their responsibilities when a teen starts to drive. Taught by trained law enforcement personnel, it creates awareness of possible consequences, both financial and physical, of distracted or impaired driving, and provides applicable information about collision prevention. Parents and students will sign a confirmation of attendance at the end of the class. Only students who have completed this class will be given parking permits.

Are there extra-curricular activities that you would like to pursue but don't have the funds to do so? If so, then you are eligible to apply for The Joie de Vivre (Joy of Life) Scholarship, which is a multiple award on-going scholarship. Awards are given to those who are interested in participating in activities such as sports, music, theater, martial arts and camps, but do not have the financial resources to pay for them. You must be under 18 years of age, demonstrate financial need, be actively involved in community service, be a U.S. Citizen or Legal Resident, and show good citizenship and behavior in school.
